CELEBRATING POSSIBILITIES

The hot weather has caught up with us. For me, it is a good time to stay in the house with the air conditioning running. It brings back memories of the hot days growing up in southern Illinois. We didn't have air conditioning yet, so a lot of time was spent outside on the porch or in the swing on the front lawn. We lived on a farm and the house sat on a rolling hill. The gentle breezes were a blessing when we could catch them. As in Mayberry, you waved at everyone driving past the house even if you didn't know them. With the COVID pandemic and the unrest around us, sometimes I think I would like to be transported back to those times when I did not know what to be anxious over.

My heart goes out to teachers in Georgia and across the US as they are either returning to school in person, doing school virtually or both. It hit home recently when my son who is a band director called and said mom, "I need to talk. I am scared to go back to school." I had just been thinking about the health of the children. Watching a video of Gerry Brooks this morning, he was saying it is like a dart game. Administrators and teachers have the darts aimed at them. They cannot win...there is no place to move. Keep our teachers, administrators, Alpha Delta Kappa Sisters and students in your thoughts and prayers as they face this time of uncertainty.

In July, your state Executive Board met for their planning retreat by way of Zoom. We missed the time to bond together but we did some good planning. Linda Chambers was our facilitator and kept us focused. The four main goals for the biennium are Membership, Leadership, Communication and Altruism. We will be celebrating each and making plans to enhance each of the goals. Under Membership, our hope is to establish one or two collegiate chapters. At this time the membership team and some sisters who are teaching at the college level are participating in training to learn how to organize collegiate chapters. It is a four-week training lead by the collegiate chapter at Ball State in Indiana. In the area of Altruism, the Executive Board decided we did not want Gayle Owen's legacy C2O, "Connecting to Others," to die. Already many of the newer members have not heard of C2O. We added it as a

required portion of the Cornucopia Award. C2O, "Connecting to Others," is not just giving a check but working with others face to face. That might be serving dinner at the Ronald McDonald or community center, showering your local fire department with goodies, making cards or playing bingo with senior adults, working in a food or clothes closet, etc. I received a GA 101 from a south Georgia chapter this week and practically every altruism project was connecting with the community. This is a form of communication with others and it can add to our membership when we are visible to others and spread the word about Alpha Delta Kappa. This credit will be given when it is highlighted on the GA 101. One of the optional items added to the Cornucopia will be World Understanding. Whether you devote a whole meeting to World Understanding or Fraternity Education, it is important for GA A Δ K to learn about the world around us, to be interested in people that may be different from us and to be humble, show mercy and justice. In the coming months, I will explain each of our goals and how they relate to our chapters. We will take time to celebrate each goal and develop possibilities of attaining the state goals.

If your chapter does not have a Policies and Procedures pamphlet or manual, start considering developing one.

As I have stated in each newsletter,

Let's start seizing every possibility/opportunity to grow and maintain membership, to develop leadership, to give generously of our time and money and to tell others about our wonderful women educators' organization.

Once the International database is updated, we will import all the sisters in Georgia into the Georgia Database so you will not have to go through an approval process.
