CELEBRATING POSSIBILITIES

September has arrived and most of you have headed back to the classroom for the 2020-2021 school year. I have heard the frustration from teachers all across the state about whether you would teach virtually or in person, and whether you would work from home or in your classroom. Will you be quarantined or will you teach if you have been exposed to the virus? My heartfelt feelings and prayers go out to each one of you. I just pray that you and your students remain safe.

COVID has hit our Georgia Alpha Delta Kappa family. This past week, Lisa Fore (Golden Isles Gamma Nu) lost her 68 year old mother to it and Lori Carnine (Albany Alpha Rho) lost her mother-in-law. Shelby Clark, Debbie Clark's daughter in law, a member of Alpha Beta Golden Isles has tested

positive for COVID. Eleanor Ivestor, Gamma Delta in Athen's District also has COVID. I am sure there have been more touched personally with relatives or friends that I do not know about. If you are on Facebook, join the GA Alpha Delta Kappa page or request to be my friend so I can be kept aware of your celebrations and concerns.

I want to urge chapters to meet via Zoom. Schedule your normal social time so members can catch up with each other. Some chapters plan to meet in person in open air spaces. If you do meet in person, be sure to wear masks and stay 6 feet apart. I do not want any of our members placed in danger.

Albany, Golden Isles, and Heart of Georgia had their Officers Training via Zoom. All three meetings were excellent with the officers breaking out into chat rooms. Since May 2020, members may join meetings virtually if they physically can not attend.

GOAL I: MEMBERSHIP

Celebrating Membership:
On March 13, 1954, Alpha
Chapter was formed with 27
members. Four years later at the second National Convention in
Kansas City, Georgia had grown to 24 chapters. Membership continued to grow reaching 1200 in the late 60's. In 1974, we had 64 chapters and 1484 members and by 1980 there were 69 chapters and 2,040 members. A membership high of 2,400 members was reached in 1988.

Since that time and with the current changing times we have dropped in membership to begin this biennium with 1,705 members. During the 2018-2020 biennium 77 new members were initiated.

GA AAK has 72 chapters. We have some work to do but let's *celebrate our* rich heritage and past leaders.

In July, your Executive Board had a Zoom planning retreat to establish goals for this biennium. Membership was our first priority. The goals are:

- To increase Georgia's membership by 75 members.
 - The method to do this is to provide quality and attractive programs
 - To promote community service activities which speak to the younger generations, led by the Chapter Altruism Chairman
 - Use the Membership
 Development Manual and
 Kappa for ideas for recruitment
 and reinstatements.
- Retain Georgia AAK members
 - To provide quality and attractive programming, led by Chapter Presidents and President's Elect
 - To promote community service to retain members, led by the Altruism Chairman
 - To recognize and encourage members by highlighting members at meetings and in newsletters.
 - To use effective communication skills.
- Add 2 new chapters in geographic areas where potential members are located.
- Start 2 new collegiate chapters.
 - Locate colleges/universities with teacher education programs that have AΔK members on staff.
 - Evaluate district members' and staff members' willingness to support Collegiate Chapters.
 - The state membership team participated in 4 Zoom meetings discussing the procedure to start collegiate chapters. We will be participating in a monthly meeting led by the North Central Region.
- Attendance
 - To encourage attendance at chapter meetings by listening to members' needs. Volunteer to drive a member, make calls, write letters, and use electronic communication.



Don't forget the deadline to submit for the Classroom Grant is September 15th, just 15 days away. If this grant is not particularly one that fits your needs, contemplate the other scholarships and grants available including Georgia's Past State Presidents' Scholarship. The Past Presidents' Scholarship Fund was created for the purpose of assisting members in attending personal or professional continuing education programs outside of Alpha Delta Kappa events. Remember this scholarship was designed specifically for attending non-Alpha Delta Kappa sponsored conferences, conventions, seminars and workshops and may not be used for college course credit or personal travel. Deadline for the Past President's Scholarship is February 1st. February may seem like a long time from now, but that just gives you plenty of time to contemplate applying for it.

Between the Classroom Grant deadline on Sept. 15th and the Past President's Scholarship deadline on Feb. 1st, there are also many scholarships and grants with deadlines in October and November. Be sure to look at the Scholarship & Grants link under the Membership tab on the GA Alpha Delta Kappa website for more details including deadlines for applications. The Regional Professional Development mini grants, the Innovation Grant, and Fine Arts Grant are just three examples of grants and scholarships with deadlines coming up.
