

FRATERNITY ED FUN

Here are some fun holiday Fraternity Ed activities for you to try ---

I. Challenge your sisters during your December meeting, online or in person, to build a special snowman (or woman!), part by part, as questions are asked about Alpha Delta Kappa. Each time a member gets a correct answer on her paper, she adds a part or item to her snowman. See who can "build" a complete snowman and/or who can make the best-looking snowman! Show all the creations proudly at the end! Order of snowman parts: bottom(base), middle(stomach), top (head), eyes, nose, mouth, arms with hands, piece of clothing, something extra (scarf, pipe, broom, etc.), any ADK item! Following are some questions: 1). What is the name of your District?. 2.) Who is your District Chairman? 3.) How long is a term of office for each elected chapter officer? [2 years] 4.)How many chapter meetings are required each year? [9] 5.) Who fulfills the office of chapter president if the elected president is unable to complete her term? [the chapter past president] 6.) Which officer shares a "Thought for the Day" at each gathering? [chaplain] 7.) What is the name of the chapter to which all deceased sisters belong? [Omega] 7.) What document is due on March 15, 2021 from each chapter and state? [Bylaws or Policy Statement 8.)How many years shall a woman be in the education profession before being asked to join ADK? [1] 9.) How does a former member rejoin ADK? [by following reinstatement guidelines through International] 10.) Where is ADK International in 2021? [Austin, TX].

II. Have each member draw a wreath or a tree with simple decorations on it (balls, candy canes, etc.). Write the name of sisters present on separate ornaments. Cut wreath or tree into 10 pieces; mix them up.. Say "GO" and sisters put her wreath or tree back together like a puzzle, but hold out the last puzzle piece. (If you meet in person, share puzzles to reasemble.) Then, whichever sister's name is on the puzzle piece in each sister's hand gets to hear why she is a holiday treasure to your chapter. If same names are left. just do each name once and finish with leftover names. Let your sisters know how much each one is special to all of you!

III. If you want to blend Frat Ed with World Understanding, try this! Give sisters a list of countries (or make multiple choice questions with country info). Read a Christmas, Hanukkah, or holiday tradition to go with each listed country. Have the sisters match the country to the tradition - one at a time or all at once - before giving answers. You can even answer orally by ringing a sleigh bell to see who answers first!

Give a little prize for winner of any of these activities or maybe just hand out participation goodies for all! Enjoy your chapter holiday fun
