It's Celebration Time!

Reminders for dues deadlines are now in the past. **CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL CHAPTERS FOR 100% ON TIME REPORTING AND PAYMENT OF DUES!!!** There are disappointments as resignations are received, but joys as invitees accept membership in Georgia Alpha Delta Kappa . Your state treasurer encourages the chapter treasurers and members to keep in contact with the resigned members and invite them to reinstate their membership.

A little reminder: Membership renewals postmarked after January 31, 2021 must be accompanied with late fees - an additional \$5.00 for International dues and \$1.00 for State dues.

Timely Reporting Award: Congratulations to Gamma Chapter for being the first chapter to remit dues for 2021 in October and the Albany District to have all chapters remit state dues by the January 31, 2021 deadline.

Some chapters have received a Tax Year Form 1099 INT for interest earned by their scholarship/savings account from the bank. You do not report this amount now. Please keep this form because you will use the amount of interest your account received in 2020 on the C-1 Annual Chapter Reporting Form & Audit. This is due by June 30 to the State Treasurer. Alpha Delta Kappa's tax reporting time is June 1-May 31 of each year.

Happy Valentine's Day!!! One item we need to review yearly is the Greek Alphabet because our chapter structure and order of chartering are based on it. Many words in our language are derived from these beautiful letters and they are really FUN both to learn and to say aloud! I learned the Greek alphabet as a song in college and it is a great way to learn its order. There are 24 letters and several are the same or similar to our alphabet. Contact me to visit your Zoom meeting one month; I'd be glad to explain in detail our AAK use of the Greek Alphabet.

- *Do you know the following fun facts about Greek letters?
- 1) Our word "alphabet" comes from Alpha (symbol A) and Beta (B).
- 2) Iota (I) is the smallest non-capital Greek letter and our word "iota" means "a very small amount".
- 3) Chi (X) is the first letter in the Greek spelling of "Christ"; therefore, the use of "Xmas" is just a shortened form of "Christmas".
- 4) How is our word "delta" connected to the symbol for Delta?
- *One activity is to mix up the order of names of the chapters in your district and have your ladies put them in correct Greek Alphabet order.

*Another activity you can do is to make 24 hearts with each Greek letter name (Beta) and its symbol (B) on each side of 24 hearts. Cut the hearts in half, mix letter name halves and symbol halves up well, and play a timed game of matching each letter name to its correct symbol. Lots of chaotic fun! Have a small prize for winner(s). (Email the hearts to your members ahead of the meeting if meeting online; they can cut the 24 hearts in half at home to practice matching the letter names to their symbols.)

- Report rule-breaking. If you see a post/comment that violates our rules, report it to the admins — DO NOT verbally attack the author of said post/comment.
- Think before you report. Don't report posts or comments that aren't breaking any rules just because you don't like or agree with their content.

Books Across Georgia



Happy Valentine's Day Sisters. Hope you showed yourself some love and applied for the Past State Presidents' Scholarship. Remember applications are due to be postmarked or faxed no later than February 1. You can also send them to me via email or text. Just scan it or take a picture of it, make sure you can see all 4 corners, and it is legible. All GA Alpha Delta Kappa sisters are eligible to apply for the Past State Presidents' Scholarship. It is not district specific.

The State Scholarships also must be postmarked or faxed no later than March 1. They too can be sent to me via email or text. Just scan it or take a picture of it, make sure you can see all 4 corners, and it is legible. For clarification as I know I have gotten several emails regarding the eligible districts this biennium: For 2020-2021, the State Scholarships are awarded to chapters in the Augusta District. For the second year of the biennium 2021-2022, the chapters in Athens District are the recipients. Augusta and Athens chapters, please find an applicant and a spare applicant, in case a chapter in your district is unable to find a candidate. This will allow us to award the maximum number of scholarships possible to your districts. Remember the GA Policies and Procedures v. 7.23.2020 were off by a year. When I attended all the Fall District meetings, I asked everyone to make a note of that. Hoping that clears things up for anyone with a question lingering about that. If you still have questions, feel free to contact me.




