That is one positive that the pandemic has given us--meetings by Zoom or in person and Zoom. Georgia Alpha Delta Kappa Sisters are bright stars of leadership. When they are asked, they take up the task and carry through with it. Sisterhood abounds across the state.

I am going to recap the Executive board meeting for those of you who could not attend.

- Ruth Rennick led a great interview with Ramata Diabillo and her sponsor, Denise, from Pennsylvania. Ramata is our Gulf Region ITE student. Ramata's father has 3 wives and she has 17 siblings. They are a close family. Ramata arrived in the U.S. during the pandemic and her classes have been via remote. This has caused some loneliness. Remember her with cards and emails.
- We were honored to have International President Judy Ganzert and Gulf Region IVP Terry Peyton with us and to bring greetings. Judy loved Lori's voice as she led us in the Georgia AΔK song and "Lamp of AΔK."
- Lynn Fuller gave the A∆K Month report. 100% of the chapters participated.
- Bonnie Devereaux gave the Altruism report. Bonnie will be recapping, but she reported we gave over \$524,000 and 70,000 volunteer hours this past year. Sisters, even during a pandemic your stars shone brightly.
- Robin Dudley reported that all chapters filed their Bylaws on time, YAY!
- The Board approved the awarding of five \$1500 State Scholarships to a student in each of their chapters and 4 Past State President Scholarships to GA AAK sisters to learn something fun.
- The Board also approved sending seven \$500 checks from the Disaster Relief Fund to Chi Sisters who sustained damage in the recent tornado.
- The 2021-2022 Budget was amended to make it more transparent. Under Conferences/Conventions Advisory Council was changed to Committee Chairman; Under Designated Funds Car tags was removed. That money has been put into the general account. Membership has been added and there is \$265 in that fund. In front of Disaster Relief add the word "projected" because we cannot know the exact amount at the time the budget is developed..

MPORTANTE MONEY TALK with Terri Thompson, \$tate Treasurer

The arrival of May in Alpha Delta Kappa signals the ending of Year 1 of the 2020-2022 Biennium. It is time for you treasurers to begin closing out your financial books. Alpha Delta Kappa's physical year ends May 31, 2021.

Some treasurers may still have some unfinished business to complete: 1) If you had sisters pay dues and fees after February 1, 2021, be sure you included a late fee of \$1.00 for State Dues. 2) If your chapter reinstated a former Alpha Delta Kappa sister February 1 - May 31, 2021, her State Dues and Fees are due now. Please send a \$4.00 check and GA - 102R State Scholarship Fee Form for Reinstated Members to Shannon Cole, VP for Scholarships and a \$12.00 check and GA - 103R State Dues and Courtesy/Hospitality Fee Form for Reinstated Members to Terri Thompson, State Treasurer. 3) Newly initiated members for 2021 do not pay State Dues and Fees until the January after they are initiated.

Headquarters has updated the Chapter Annual Reporting Form and Audit/Cash Flow Form (formerly the C-1). It can be found on the International website - www.alphadeltakappa.org - under the Documents and Forms tab for Chapters. They have prepared a Financial Instructional Booklet with Chapter Treasurers Guidelines on page 20. It has sample forms and spreadsheets where you are able to type directly onto the forms. This way you are able to submit them electronically to the State Treasurer or you may print them off and submit via snail mail. Discard any old blank C-1 Forms you may have saved to use June 2021.

Chapters, if you have received from the bank a Tax Year Form 1099 - INT for interest earned by your scholarship/savings account, please use it for the amount of interest your account received in 2020 on the Cash Flow/Annual Chapter Reporting Form and Audit (Formerly the C-1).

Altruistic Giving is Up!

What a COVID year we have had! Schools closed for a while, no toilet paper, no group meetings, and yet $A\Delta K$ sisters managed to increase their altruistic work over the previous year except for scholarship being slightly down. During a time when it makes perfect sense that giving would be down, here is what Georgia sisters have done for the year:

- Volunteer hours in the name of $A\Delta K$: 50,235 hours
- Monetary Gifts in the name of AΔK: \$223,853
- Other Monetary Gifts in the name of AΔK: \$226,127
- Scholarships in the name of AΔK: \$74,739
- Total giving: \$524,719. That is over one-half million dollars!

In the February state newsletter, I first sent out information to you about our BAG project. Less than three months later sisters performed miraculous work for children in Georgia. - Each Georgia Sister, be sure and tell your chapter delegates your opinion about the International Bylaws Amendment Proposals being voted on at the International Convention. Many of our chapters have set aside their bylaws and are following the International bylaws along with the chapters Policies and Procedures. WORLD UNDERSTANDING

As promised, here are some highlights of the second proposal for the 2021-2023 International World Understanding Project.

R.I.S.E. stands for Reaching and Inspiring Students in Ethiopia. This project would build a new 2nd/3rd grade school building in Chloe Village, Ethiopia. The four classroom building would enable The Community Project: Ethiopia to double the number of students in the existing campus, which now includes four classrooms for grades K-1. The campus already includes a donated playground structure, learning & seed propagation gardens, a hand washing station, two clean composting latrines, and a small block making factory.

The core mission of The Community Project: Ethiopia is to bring education to underserved children and the community of Chole Village, located near Debre Birhan, Ethiopia. If funded, the R.I.S.E. project will positively impact women, children, and the community. This campus is located high on the Amhara Plateau (9,200 ft. elevation), which ranks among the poorest of regions in all Ethiopia.

The five impact areas of this project are: Academic Education, Health & Hygiene Education, Agricultural Education, Physical Education, and Women & Community Involvement.

Ethiopia has a two-shift school system which will allow a new building to serve 400 children - 200 each shift. This project would provide education to twice the number of children in this region, which will help families move out of the cycle of generational poverty. Health & Hygiene is also a focus at The Community Project. Children learn about and use the campus composting toilets and are instructed in good hand washing routines that will encourage healthy habits. One other area that will be impacted is physical education. More children will have the opportunity to use the existing playground structure, which will reap long-lasting results. Outdoor exercise helps with concentration and achievement in school; as well as promoting life skills such as sharing, taking turns, negotiation, and leadership development. The final impact area will be women and community. If more children are in school, more women will have the time to seek work or practice a trade. The community will also benefit because the school buildings are open in the evenings and on weekends for their use.

Stay tuned for next month's article highlighting "Sewing Seeds of Hope ". During the month of June, every member will have the opportunity to vote for the next World Understanding Project.
