Your State Treasurer sends wishes for a successful school year with No Pandemic. For you retired sisters (like me), it is nice to sleep in and not hear the call, "Back to School". But you are still needed to assist, help, and give advice when you are able.

Let me encourage all treasurers to begin using the new format of the Financial Forms (Excel workbook spreadsheets) for your chapter financial documents. Inputting data into the Revenue and Expenses tabs are intended to keep "up to date" monthly and will automatically populate the data for the Cash Flow, Balance Sheet and Budget tabs. Then in May 2022 at the end of the physical year, the year end report has already been completed. Just click and print.

Reminders -

- 1) Chapter and District Treasurers establish a
 Budget Committee meeting to prepare your 2021-2022 Budget.
- 2) Be sure to file online the 990-N IRS e-Postcard and send a copy of the Confirmation to your State Treasurer by Oct. 15, 2021. This is a Cornucopia requirement for Timely Reporting. You do not have to wait to file the 990-N IRS e-Postcard. Go ahead and complete this task before your school year and your monthly chapter Alpha Delta Kappa meetings begin. Your State Treasurer would love to announce that Georgia chapters are 100% complete with filing the 990-N IRS e-Postcard at the September State Executive Board Meeting.
- 3) Be sure that your 2020-2021 Financial Documents have been audited. Your chapter or district Audit Committee can do this.

GA State altruistic Project:
Ronald McDonald House (RMH)

In 1998, the Ronald McDonald House in Georgia was chosen as the state altruistic project. The purpose of these houses is to give a free place for families with sick children to stay. A warm meal is provided each evening and a cold meal at breakfast. The houses are located near children's hospitals. There are five in GA: Albany, Atlanta, Augusta, Macon, and Savannah. To qualify to use these services, a family must live more than fifty miles from the hospital, as a one-day trip to the hospital would be difficult at that distance, especially if their child has to be admitted for several days or longer. Of course, these families are very grateful for a place to stay and the houses usually fill up quickly. One of the benefits of using RMH is the support families give each other while they are there. Many of our Georgia sisters who live near these houses volunteer in a variety of ways. Thanks for all the support you have given through the years.

WORLD UNDERSTANDING

Congratulations to Project C.H.E.A.R, our 2021-2023 World Understanding Project! All sisters had the opportunity to vote in June on the three proposals and the winner was announced at our first virtual International Convention in July. Project C.H.E.A.R. stands for "Making a Children's Home with Education and Agriculture a Reality in Tanzania." Tanzania is a country in East Africa with a population of over 58 million people. This project is aimed at building a 44-bed children's home and a school with at least two classrooms, a technology media center, and library. Funds raised will also assist in developing agricultural areas with gardens, fruit trees, and livestock. These agricultural areas will allow learning opportunities for the children, as well as helping the children's home to become self-sustaining. We, as Alpha Delta Kappa sisters, now have a project to focus on this next biennium to show our love and support for others. World Understanding is one of our founding and guiding principles, so let's all work together and make it a reality by supporting our new World Understanding Project. More information will be shared in the coming months on ways you can support the new project. You can start by looking for ways to share information with your chapter about Tanzania and its people, as well as the Harambee Foundation, a 501(c)3 nonprofit public charity who is working with the government registered local community of Bambati, Tanzania where our project will be located.

Our Jacqueline Lougheed World Understanding Lecturer for the 32nd International Convention was Avril Benoit. Avril is the Executive Director of Doctor Without Borders/Medecins Sans Frontiers in the United States (MSF-USA) and has worked with this organization since 2006 in various capacities. She was an inspiring speaker and if you missed her session, it's definitely worth watching. The biggest takeaway I had was the similarity in the key philosophies of her organization and ours, as educators. Here are the key philosophies she shared: Discussion-Based Management, Collective Decision Making, Consider other Views, Reflect on Mistakes, Decision-Making at the Lowest Level, and Be Adaptable. Our Alpha Delta Kappa organization, being made up entirely of educators shares these same philosophies. Thanks to Judy Ganzert and her wonderful team that put together this virtual International Convention -- something that had never been done before, but turned out to be amazing. Hopefully, we will all get to be together in person for future International/State Conventions and Regional Conferences; but knowing we can adapt, if needed, makes me proud.


