FALL into renewing your Alpha Delta Kappa membership by paying dues. Don't LEAVE the task undone. By now every member should have received her International Dues invoice from Headquarters where you have the option of paying only International dues one of three ways - online by PayPal, online by personal credit card or mail in a personal check with a copy of your invoice to Headquarters. A number of sisters have chosen to directly pay Headquarters by one of the methods mentioned above.

However, there is another option: You are still able to pay all dues and fees (International, State, District and Chapter) with one check to your chapter treasurer if your chapter decides to continue to collect dues the way it has been done in the past. Then the chapter treasurer will forward your dues to the appropriate place with a chapter roster showing which sisters are paying dues with the chapter check.

Because Headquarters is not issuing a H-138 Dues Payment form, a GA Chapter Roster will need to be included with the State Dues payment check and will meet the Cornucopia Requirements as voted on and approved by the GA Executive Board at their Fall Executive Board Meeting September 18, 2021. This NEW Georgia Chapter Roster Form will be sent to chapter treasurers very soon.

**Chapter Treasurers**, if you collect International dues, continue to include them as a line item in your 2021-2022 Chapter Budget. But if you are not collecting International dues, delete that item from your Chapter Budgets.

Chapter & Districts Budgets are due by November 1, 2021.

Do Not Forget: by October 15, 2021 - 990-N IRS e-Postcard is filed online and then send a copy of the confirmation to State Treasurer Terri.





I look forward to traveling more as the world begins to open back up. I would love to be able to visit some of the schools we support through our International World Understanding donations. Who is ready to go with me?



I am a real country girl. I grew up on a dairy farm in the Appalachian mountains of Virginia. I can actually milk a cow by hand. Since my state left out the 7th grade so the boys could be drafted into the Korean War, I graduated high school at 16. I turned 17 the day I enrolled at Mary Washington College of the University of VA (now the University of Mary Washington). I majored in Biology/Chemistry planning to go to Medical school. God had other plans for me. I now have an MEd in middle Grades education from GA State University in 1993.

I taught school for 35 years before retiring in 2006 from public school. I taught every grade except Kindergarten and 4th grade including high school Chemistry and Biology.
