While working, I observed primary children hugging and loving each of their classmates, but by the time they reached 7th grade the color of the skin and family economics began to establish barriers between children, The old song from "South Pacific" *You Have to Be Taught to Hate*" is so true. As Alpha Delta Kappa sisters, we must be a sisterhood loving and respecting each other no matter one's religion, race or political beliefs. May we be examples to the communities around us. Remember: love, faith and hope, but love is the greatest. Enjoy Valentine's Day and do something special with your spouse, significant other, or your A ΔK sisters or just love and be good to yourself.

I am looking forward to reading to my granddaughter's first grade class in Greenville this week and to observe love at work among the children. One book that I will be reading is "More Than Anything Else" by Marie Bradby. It tells the story of how Booker T. Washington as a young boy was working in the salt mines with his dad. A man came to town who could read a newspaper. Booker knew then that more than anything he wanted to learn to read. The man helped him learn his letters and write his name. I think this will encourage 1st graders to want to learn how to read but sets the stage for Black History Month. This month always gave my school the opportunity to have special speakers and events including a potluck soul food meal. I also plan to read "Ruby the Copycat" by Peggy Rathmann which encourages children to be happy with their own talents and who they are. No matter who we are we have worth and talents and can contribute to our community and AAK chapter and organization.

As Covid has raised its ugly head again since the holidays, continue to be loyal to your chapter. Sisterhood is the glue that holds us together. treasurers for remitting State Dues and Fees for your chapter's membership. At press time, Georgia Alpha Delta Kappa is 97% for On Time Reporting and Payment for State Dues/Fees and the GA Chapter Roster Form.

There is still time for the non-paying members to pay their 2022 dues and fees. Membership renewals postmarked after January 31, 2022 must include a late fee (\$1.00 for State Dues/Fees and \$5.00 for International dues).

There have been disappointments as resignations are received, but joys as invitees accept membership into Georgia Alpha Delta Kappa. Your state treasurer encourages the chapter treasurers and members to keep in contact with the resigned members and invite them to reinstate their memberships.

Some chapters and districts have received a **Tax Year Form 1099-INT** for interest earned by their scholarship/savings account from the bank. You do not report this amount now. Please keep this form because you will use the amount of interest your account received in 2021 on the Cash Flow Statement (formerly C-1/D-1 Annual Reporting Form and Audit). This is due by June 30 to the State Treasurer. Alpha Delta Kappa's tax reporting time is June 1- May 31 of each year.

As our 2020-2022 biennium is coming to an end, please refer to page 10 of the Financial Booklet for Record and Retention Requirements.

The badge of Alpha Delta Kappa is a very important part of our sorority's history and its insignia. We love to wear our badge, but what are some do's and don't's concerning this cherished symbol? Here are a few questions to ask your members about the badge. On Zoom they can use Thumbs Up for Yes/True and Thumbs Down for No/False OR have ladies just number 1-10 on a paper and write T or F for each question! 1. The badge is worn over the heart, not on a lapel or a ribbon.

2. The badge is worn below all other Alpha Delta Kappa pins.

3. If a chapter president has earned more than one guard as an officer, she may wear each one at the same time.

4. The badge may be correctly worn on formal dress.

5. The badge is worn as fraternal identification and not to be worn as jewelry.

6. If a member, upon joining Omega Chapter, has designated a new member to receive her badge, the newly initiated member can receive the badge without any financial obligation.

7. The badge is to be worn at all chapter meetings, S/P/N meetings, Regional Conferences, and International meetings of the sorority.

8. The badge is always worn on the left bodice and one's nametag is always worn on the right.

9. Our badge may be worn on the jacket of a dress or outer apparel that is considered part of an ensemble.

10. Our badge may be worn at any educational meeting.

Just scan or take a picture of it, make sure you can see all 4 corners, and it is legible. All GA Alpha Delta Kappa sisters are eligible to apply for the Past State Presidents' Scholarship. It is not district specific. The goal this year is to double the number of applications received from last year's 4 to at least 8 this year. Fingers crossed, Let's Go Sisters!

The State Scholarships also must be postmarked or emailed no later than March 1. They too can be sent to me via postal service, email, or text. Just scan or take a picture of it, make sure you can see all 4 corners, and it is legible. For 2022, the chapters in Athens District are the recipients. Athens sisters I know have been working hard to find an heir and a spare applicant, in case a chapter in their district was unable to find a candidate. Remember doing this will allow us to award the maximum number of scholarships possible to your districts. Don't forget the GA Policies and Procedures were revised, and the rotation is back on the correct annual sequence. See pages 37-48 of the manual revised 04.19.2021. 


