




October is Alpha Delta Kappa Founder's Month





REINSTATED MEMBER REGISTRATION PROCESS

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

- Contact International Headquarters for assistance if you do not know your username and password.
- Know the name of your previous chapter and the name of the chapter you are joining, e.g. "Alabama Alpha," "Arizona Alpha Alpha."
- Reach out to the Chapter President and share your interest to reinstate and obtain the Chapter President's ID Number.
- Be sure you have easily available your PayPal or credit card payment information.

TO REINSTATE A MEMBER

Type in the Alpha Delta Kappa.org URL.

Click on the MEMBERSHIP tab.

Click on "Reinstate Membership" and follow these directions.

- Log in using your Alpha Delta Kappa username and password.
- Complete professional and educational information.
- Choose payment method.
- Pay Internation dues using PayPal or a credit card.

World Understanding

The International World Understanding Committee has been working diligently on new guidelines and they are now listed on the international website. Applications are being accepted through October 1, 2024. Any member may submit an application to be considered for the 2025-2027 World Understanding Project. To access the application, go to www.alphadeltakappa.org, then login with your username and password, then go to Foundation>World Understanding>World Understanding Project Application. You must follow the guidelines exactly or the application will not be considered. There is a sample showing the steps to follow and all documents needed.

By **November 15, 2024**, the International World Understanding Committee will adjudicate and identify the top five proposals, then send them to our International President.

By **December 15, 2024**, the IEB (International Executive Board) will select the top three and notify the World Understanding Committee chairman.

By **February 15, 2025**, the top three proposals will be announced on the International website, CONNECT, and International News. A summary of the top three proposals will be sent to Regional and S/P/N Presidents for publication.

The March 2025 Kappan will have an article with summaries and pictures of the three proposals.

Spring 2025 (date to be determined) - ALL members will have an opportunity to vote on their choice for the next World Understanding Project

July 2025 - International Convention, Austin TX - the 2025-2027 World Understanding Project will be announced, with fundraising to begin immediately.

The purpose of the International World Understanding Project is to promote educational excellence and altruism through support of global initiatives that align with Alpha Delta Kappa's purposes and mission. This program allows all member to contribute to world understanding, goodwill, and peace by supporting projects dedicated to providing educational opportunities that are designed to improve the lives of children and families in communities around the world.



Our last World Understanding Project for 2021-2023 was Project C.H.E.A.R., Sisters combined fundraising efforts made it possible to donate over \$73,000. to this chosen project. Project C.H.E.A.R.'s mission is to empower disadvantages children and youth in Bambati, Tanzania through education.






