Helen Hunt Jackson's poem September - The golden-rod is yellow, the corn is turning brown, the trees in apple orchards with fruit are bending down. By all these lovely tokens September days are here, with summer's best of weather, and autumn's best of cheer. But none of all this beauty which floods the earth and air is unto me the secret which makes September fair. "T" is a thing which I remember, to name it thrills me yet. One day of one September I never can forget. - reminds us that Fall will follow soon. (Lines 1-4, 17-20, 21-24, and 25-28)

This time of year brings cool, crisp mornings, warm afternoons, and balmy evenings. It is a perfect time for day trips to the North Georgia mountains for "apple picking". Red, green, and yellow varieties are in abundance. It is

one of my favorite fall excursions. If you are unable to find an orchard, roadside markets tempt you to take home a dozen or two bags of "just picked" varieties.

According to the AI companion on my computer, apples are associated with teachers due to a mix of historical reasons: 1) In the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries, they served as a practical form of payment or sustenance for teachers, who were often provided housing and food by families, especially on the American frontier. 2) The apple also carries a symbolic meaning, representing the fruit of knowledge from the biblical Tree of Knowledge. 3) The apple serves as a symbol of gratitude and appreciation from students to their

educators, especially around the time of the autumn harvest when apples were plentiful.

4) Apples were a readily available and versatile gift, and they wer often harvested at the beginning of the school year, making them a logical choice. 5 ) And lastly the association was further solidified in popular culture with the phrase - "an apple for the teacher" becoming a well know idiom by the early 20<sup>th</sup> century.

My first year of teaching, I received a special "apple" ornament from a dear student that I still hang on my Christmas tree every year. I hope you receive a special "apple" sometime!

And as we honor our traditions, let's remember to "Focus on the Future" in Georgia Alpha Delta Kappa!





# Relief

On September 21, 2024 the Executive Bord / Advisory Council of GA Alpha Delta Kappa held a meeting. At that meeting, we set up a table to take donations for Disaster Relief. In an appeal to the sisters present, Jewel said that all it would take was one hurricane to come through Savannah and we would need all the funds we could raise to help our sisters. Just 6 days later, on September 27<sup>th</sup>, Hurricane Helene roared through the state wreaking havoc from south Georgia up to Augusta and beyond. You came through with SO MANY donations! Georgia sisters came through with gracious hearts and open wallets so that other sisters could receive help without depleting our Disaster Relief funds.

Disaster Relief distributed 12 grants of \$500 each to Georgia sisters and 3 grants of \$250 each to neighboring states during the first year of the 2024-2026 biennium, 13 of them a direct result of Helene. In the second year of the biennium, 2 sisters have been awarded \$500 grants.

Disaster Relief is here to help. Of course, we encourage you to donate to this worthy cause, but we also encourage you to ask for help when you need it!! We will have a Disaster Relief table at all the district

meetings this fall and spring. Once again, we will be accepting donations for chances on the Foldie Travel and Crossbody Bags that will be given away at the state convention next May. Thank you to Sherry McKie from Alpha Epsilon Chapter for donation the Foldie Travel and Crossbody Bags. There will be some travel size toiletries in the bag when the winner claims her prize.




