Educators are Heroes Membership Grant

2026 Winter/Spring Cohort



Focus: Celebrating educators and building relationships with potential members.

Funds: The funds for this grant will be given to chapters who are committed to having an event for potential members **prior to May 15, 2025**. Chapters chosen will receive a check of \$75 to **buy items for their event**. Funds for this grant will be sent **after chapter member(s) attend one of the Training Sessions**.

The International Membership Committee (IMC) encourages the use of the relationship-building conversations to help sisters find what potential educators might be looking for in membership. As part of this grant, chapter leaders will attend a training Session via Zoom to learn how to plan a social event that focuses on relationship-building and value. This training will also provide an opportunity to brainstorm ideas with leaders across our organization.

First priority for this grant will be given to those chapters who have not previously received the Educators Are Heroes Grant. All chapters are encouraged to apply!

TIMELINE

January 9 - JotForm closes. Chapters will be notified of acceptance within one week.

Training Session - Thursday, January 15 @ 6:30 pm CT or Thursday, January 22 @ 5:00 pm CT At least one chapter member must attend at least one training. All interested chapter members are welcome to attend.

- Planning for and executing a social event that focuses on relationship-building and values
- Strategies for following up with potential members

● Checks will be sent out after the meeting and should arrive the week of February 2

● S/P/N leaders from the chapters involved are encouraged to attend

Check-In Support Session 1 - Wednesday, March 25 @ 6:30 pm CT - Material will be reviewed and chapters will have the opportunity to share their plans for a prospective member social, ask questions, and gather ideas from other chapters in the cohort.

Check-In Support Session 2 - Sunday, April 19 @ 6:30 pm CT - Chapters will share the status of their prospective member social, get questions answered, and gather ideas/support from other sisters.

May 15 - Deadline to have the social event for prospective members

Reflection Session - Wednesday, May 27 @ 6:30 pm CT - One or more chapter members are asked to attend this event to share their experience and to gather ideas and insight from other chapters.

- Strategies for implementing the New Member Onboarding process
