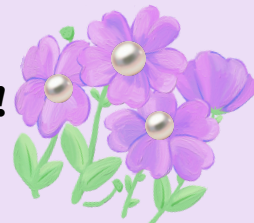
We will start Sunday morning off with a sweet, special Memorial Service to acknowledge sisters who have joined the Omega Chapter during the past two years.

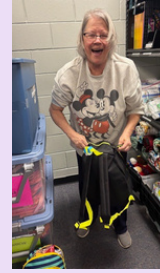

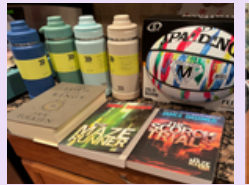

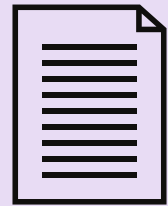

World Understanding Making a Better World Initiative



The World Understanding Committee would like to introduce you to a very special program called Making a Better World Initiative (MBWI). Making a Better World Initiative is an annual recognition program designed to:

- Promote and recognize Alpha Delta Kappa members, chapters, states, provinces or nations for outstanding contributions to cross-cultural learning and relationships and/or increasing awareness of and involvement in global issues.
- This optional, non-competitive initiative: Recognizes outstanding programs or projects that make a significant contribution to societies at home and/or around the world
- Advances cross-cultural learning and relationship building
- Encourages social responsibility; o Increases awareness of and involvement in global issues
- Raises awareness of Alpha Delta Kappa members' impact worldwide.

The World Understanding Committee is aware that we have some wonderful programs happening in our regions that connect well with this program. All of the information regarding this program, eligibility, and how to submit your program using a jot-form for submission can be found on the Alpha Delta Kappa website under the dropdown FOUNDATION under the tab Making a Better World Initiative. National Consumer Protection Week

Speaking of “LOVE”, The FTC (Federal Trade Commission) is warning about February traditionally being the month with the most online frauds and other scams including dating and romance scams. The FTC website can be used to report scams which are then tracked. The top 5 currently being reported by the FTC are:

1. Fake IRS calls – just in time for tax returns
2. Deepfakes and Cloning – AI can be used to mimic voices in “grandparent scams” with emotionally charged scenarios
3. Formjacking/Digital Skimming – Code is put into emails or forms to ask users to input sensitive information including credit card information
4. Fake DMV offices/Text Scams (or in GA fake Peach Pass toll violation emails/texts)
5. Dating/Romance Scams – Long-con scams where fraudsters build trust over weeks before requesting money for “emergencies” – similar to emails requesting purchases of gift cards

The #1 prevention is to be aware of emails and phone calls and if you DO find yourself in the middle of a scam – STOP – do not feel rushed to make any decisions. Be suspicious of links or attachments in emails with scenarios that do not make sense. Call the “real” sender if you know them on the phone to verify. Be safe!

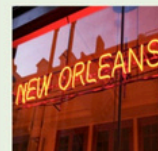

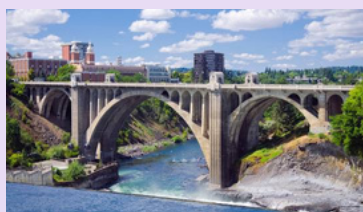

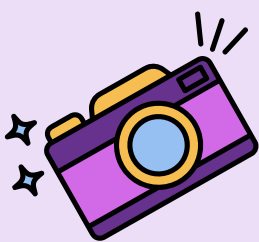
Do You Know?

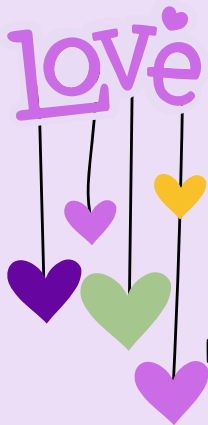

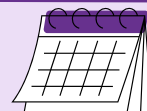

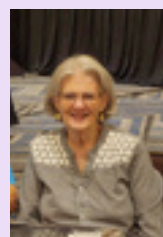
