



FOUNDERS' SQUARE

Robertson**

- Early education credentials with music major and art minor from Missouri State College and Peabody College in Tennessee

- Accepted a job with educational company, traveling most of the United States and Canada, forming connections, realizing a need for an organization that would facilitate teachers coming together

- Former Ex. Director Opal Lunsford said, "In AΔK Agnes was the promoter and did the traveling."



Marie Neal

- Teaching certificate in high school history and economics from Baker University

- Believed a fraternal organization could create a strong bond between women

- Traveling with her husband's company that worked closely with public schools, she had opportunity to meet many educators and teachers

- Served as Ex. Secretary-Treasurer from 1947 until her death in 1969



Hattie Poppino

- Earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Emporia State Teachers College

- Taught commerce and library at Kansas high schools

- Instrumental in formulating the policies and aspirations of Alpha Delta Kappa



Marion Southall

- Received teaching credentials from Baker University

- Employed by a local publishing house where she was in charge of proofreading and accounting

- Served as the first National Vic-President and head of the Ex. Board

- Official song was composed by her children, Carolyn and Richard Southall
