“Welcome Sweet Springtime” to all! As I write this greeting to you, in just three days we “spring” forward in a time change. Be sure to set your clocks one hour ahead on March 8th! And then in fifteen days, Spring officially arrives - the vernal equinox on March 20th. Having taught middle school science most of my teaching career, I cannot resist sharing scientific knowledge with you. *Vernal* translates to “new” and “fresh”, and *equinox* derived from the Latin *aequus* (equal) and *nox* (night). So what does this mean? Essentially, our hours of daylight—the period of time each day between sunrise and sunset—have been growing slightly longer each day since the winter solstice this past December, which is the shortest day of the year (at least in terms of light). Even though we know that after the winter solstice, days start getting steadily longer, we still see more darkness than light over the course of a day in those three months leading up to spring. The vernal equinox marks the turning point when daylight begins to win out over darkness. At this moment, the direct rays of the Sun are shining down on the equator producing the effect of equal day and night (give or take a few minutes). After the vernal equinox, the direct rays of the Sun migrate north of the Equator (with hours of daylight steadily growing longer) until they finally arrive at the Tropic of Cancer. The migration of the Sun’s direct rays comes to a halt on that day; this is as far north as they will go. We call this the summer solstice (*solstice* is a suspension of the migration of the Sun’s direct rays). It is the longest day of the year in terms of hours of daylight.



March is a very busy month hence the term “March Madness”! No, I’m not referring to the college basketball tournament, but all the activities that are in the month of March: Women’s History month, the time change; pi day (3.14); the first day of Spring; GA AΔK district meetings, and St.Patrick’s Day. I’m not Irish, but will celebrate the “Wearing of the Green”. It is a festive occasion and a bowl of hot Irish stew hits the spot. I do not do imitations well, but it is MARCH and I am making a feeble try to join in the fun.

I am sure all of us have Irish relatives who will be happy we are celebrating in some fashion. Make the effort and join the fun.

March also has one very important day in Georgia Alpha Delta Kappa’s history. On March 13th, Georgia AΔK will celebrate its 72nd Anniversary! Show your love of Georgia AΔK by wearing our colors - purple, green and gold or an AΔK logo. Let’s all celebrate our heritage!

And as we honor our traditions, let’s remember to “Focus on the Future” in Georgia Alpha Delta Kappa!
